Attention all EdChoice Scholarship recipients: anyone who is currently receiving this state scholarship should submit a renewal form for next year. Please email the completed electronic form back to me, and then I will upload it to the state. Others who are interested in this scholarship should check the Federal Poverty Guidelines to see if they qualify (attached). This scholarship is available for any student who is an incoming kindergartener or currently in kindergarten, first or second grade. Your family income must qualify based on the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

The first application period begins February 1 and ends April 30, 2018. There is a second application period, but some applicants throughout the state that waited for the second window did not receive the scholarship last year. It's best if you turn in all required documents as quickly as possible.
