PSR Fees

PSR fees for the 2024-2025 year will be \$30 per student.

You can pay with cash, check, or electronically.

To pay electronically, go to https://members.myeoffering.com/ and select the fund "religious education fees."

Cash can be brought to the parish office the first few weeks of classes. Checks can be made out to Divine Mercy with "PSR" and your child's name in the memo line and mailed or dropped off to the parish office, or dropped in the weekend collection in an envelope marked "PSR".

Divine Mercy Children's Choir

ALL children in grades 1—8 are invited to join the Divine Mercy Children's Choir! No prior experience is required. Students will meet in the Paulding church once or twice a month beginning October 2. Practice will begin with Benediction at 6 pm and then go until 6:40 when students will then be walked down to the Ed Center for PSR classes.

Practice dates this fall will be October 2, 9, and 30, November 6, December 4 and 18

There will also be a practice at 10 am at the Ed Center on the Sundays when the children's choir will be singing at Mass. The Children's Choir will sing the 1st and 2nd Sundays of every month, at the 10:30am Mass in Paulding beginning in October.

Students will be singing at Mass October 6 and 13, November 3 and 10, December 1

and 8. Students are also invited to sing on Christmas Morning at a 9 am Mass in Paulding (rehearsal will be at 8:30 am that day).


All adults are welcome as we work through "A Minute in the Church" booklet together. Books are provided for free! We will read through a short section and then discuss the

First Reconciliation and First Communion

Children are prepared for the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion in second grade or above. Preparation is a two year process beginning in the first grade.

It is VERY important that children preparing for First Communion be attending Mass weekly with their families.

This year, the Parent Meeting for First Reconciliation will be on Sunday,
October 20, at 7 PM in the Educational Center in Paulding. At least one parent is required to attend (students do not have to attend). If this date does not work for you, contact Theresa Conley as soon as possible to set up a separate time to meet.

As usual, we will celebrate First Reconciliation on two different dates so you can chose the date or location that works best for your family:

Monday, November 18 at 7 PM in the church in Paulding OR Tuesday,

November 19 at 7 pm in the church in Payne.

Our First Communion retreat will again be the Dragon Slavers Retreat

with Dr. John Wood! The retreat is scheduled for Saturday, March 1 at the St. Patrick Gym in Bryan, OH (610 S. Portland Street Bryan, OH). The retreat will go from 12:30 until 3:30 pm. There will be no lunch provided this year, so please eat before you arrive.

We have heard great feedback from parents and students who have attended the Dragon Slayers retreat and we promise that it will be worth your time! Please note: This retreat is for PARENTS AND CHILDREN. While at least one parent is required to attend the retreat with the child, we hope BOTH parents can attend.

Please note that sports practices and games are not adequate reasons for absence or tardiness on the day of the retreat, but if you know you cannot attend on March 1, please let Theresa Conley know and we can sign you up for a Dragon Slayers retreat on a different date. We will share more information about this Dragon Slayers retreat at our parent meeting on October 20.

New this year we will be having one more required event for First Communion families. On Saturday,

April 5 we will host a Family.

Enrichment Day for First Communion families. At least one parent should plan to attend, and all children within the family are invited to participate. The Enrichment Day will take place from 9 am until noon in the Paulding church. Included in the day will be crafts, snacks, a family scavenger hunt in the church, and practice for First Communion day.

First Communion will be celebrated at all the weekend Masses on May 3 and 4. Each First Communion family will be able to chose which Mass their child will attend that weekend for First Communion. Each family will have one reserved pew at their chosen Mass.


Damascus Catholic Youth Summer Camp

Divine Mercy Catechetical Policies

Attendance — Families should make every effort to see that their children attend religion classes. Parents are expected to have their children at class on time and to pick students up promptly. Since all sessions are offered on Wednesday "Church Nights," no school or sports activity will be accepted as an excuse to miss class. "Church Night" is respected by all three school districts in the county. If a school conflict arises on Wednesday nights, parents should contact Theresa Conley.

Arrival – Please do not drop your child off more than 10 minutes before class. Younger students should be escorted into the building. Older students who are dropped off are required to come directly into the building and into their classroom. Students are not allowed to play outside or in the hallways before or after class unless their parent is present.

Dismissal – Parents (grandparents, babysitters, etc) need to be on time to pick up their children. Those picking up students in Kindergarten and 1st grade must come into the building to pick up their children.

When arranged with the parish staff or the classroom teacher, a responsible older sibling or cousin can pick up a kindergarten or 1st grade child from class and walk them out of the building.

Care should be taken not to schedule appointments or other conflicts on Wednesdays during class time. However, should you need to pick up your child from class early, you will need to come into the building and pick up your child directly from class. If someone other than a parent, grandparent, or legal guardian of the child is coming to pick a student up from class, they will need a signed note from the parent.

Cancellations – If school is canceled for fog, classes will still meet in the evening. If school is cancelled for other inclement weather, religious education classes will be cancelled that day. We also try to post all closings on our parish social media and as an evangelus message.

If you are unsure about whether or not your child has class, please call the parish office at 419-399-2576 or contact Theresa Conley directly.

Field Trip and Off-Site Activities -

Field trips and off-site activities such as service projects and retreats are occasionally scheduled with the permission of the atechetical leader. No student will be allowed to participate in any off-site activities unless a completed permission slip (signed by a parent/guardian) is turned in. Walking over to the

church is on-site and does not require permission slips.

Health Concerns – Health and allergy information is collected on registration forms. The catechists, volunteers, and staff at Divine Mercy are not allowed to dispense or administer medication to students.

Discipline — Our main concern is to maintain a safe environment in which our youth can form a community, share faith, and enjoy the best possible learning environment. Therefore, our students must meet the following expectations:

- Behave respectfully and courteously toward catechists, adults, and other students.
 Inappropriate behavior includes disrespectful verbal and body language.
- Participate positively and be attentive in class.
- Respect parish property and the property of others.
- Follow the rules of the program and the class.

Parents will be contacted if their child repeatedly disrupts class. The catechetical leader, in consultation with the pastor, has the final say in all disciplinary situations.

Registrations are only required for new students or for those whose information needs to be updated. Please scan the QR code or return this paper form to the parish office.
