<u>Miss Kaufman - Kindergarten:</u>

On our way back from recess one day, I stopped the Kindergartners and told them to look at the tree and see what they noticed. A lot of responses was "It's fall!" I asked how do you know its fall? Again the main response was "Because the leaves are changing color." I then asked if anyone knew why the leaves changed colors. This time I got some different responses. Kendall Folsom's response as to why the leaves change color was, "Because they are sun burnt." So once we got inside from recess we stopped in the first/second grade classroom and Ms. Kuhlman had her students explain their experiment over chlorophyll and photosynthesis from the week before, as to the real reason why leaves change color. Thanks to our friends in first/second grade, the kindergarten class learned that leaves change colors due to the chlorophyll going away because of the lack of sunlight since our days are starting to get shorter.
