
Dear Parents,

Classroom Curriculum News

Mrs. Lopshire - Preschool:

The Preschool is jumping right into the Thanksgiving Season. Using our tearing, gluing, recognizing colors and listening skills we made pictures of candy corn. Keeping with that theme we used real candy corn to count, sequence and pick out different colors of turkeys on bingo sheets. Oh what fun, we're learning and it's so yummy too!!

Miss Kaufman - Kindergarten:

This week in Phonics kindergarten learned about a concept referred to as twin consonants. Students realized if they read a word that has two of the same consonant letters beside each other, such as "hill," they do not need to sound out both of the letter l's in that word. Maxton pointed out that if you sound out both the twin consonant sounds, then word you are trying to read sounds kind of funny. Students were able to practice reading other words that include twin consonants such as "inn" and "ill," but a couple students even realized that they have twin consonants within their own name!



Miss Kuhlman - 1 & 2:


The first and second graders must successfully take 5 AR quizzes within a month's time to earn a coupon to receive a personal size pizza from Pizza Hut. Most of
