Over the last 10 years the endowment has provided approximately \$20,000 in benefits for our school. The fund is set up, as usual, so that we can only spend interest accrued each year. That way we keep it growing. And the more we grow the endowment, the greater will be the potential help to the school. 




Mrs. Lopshire - Preschool:
