Classroom Curriculum News



Miss Kaufman - Kindergarten:

This past week in Kindergarten the students have had the opportunity to begin working on a new online math resource called Front Row. The Front Row app uses students responses to provide them with questions exactly at their skill level. This then allows the students to practice and advance their math skills at their own learning pace. The students have really enjoyed getting to work with this new math app and love how they can earn coins to buy items for their pig icon.

Miss Schuster - 1 & 2:

Last week, the 1st and 2nd Grade finished the readaloud story, *My*Father's Dragon, by Ruth Stiles Gannett, about a little boy named Elmer Elevator who travels to Wild Island to rescue a baby dragon, with only his knapsack on his back. He encounters many



hungry wild animals along the way, and outwits them through the items he carries in his knapsack. The students loved the book, and this week they cut out and decorated their own "knapsacks," with the items in them that Elmer used - ask the children to show you; you might be surprised to find out all the different things Elmer was carrying, and how he used them!



Mrs. Gideon - 3 & 4:

"This week in grades 3-4, Mrs. Gideon's son, Jacob, visited the classroom and played some of his original songs on his guitar. He even sang for us! Everyone loved listening and asked him many questions about how a guitar makes sound. Jacob was happy to explain it to them. He explained to them that the strings are fixed at both ends. They are elastic, which means they can vibrate when touched. The vibrations of a guitar are called standing waves. Different wave speeds lead to different frequencies or pitches of the strings. The sound varies according to the way one is playing the guitar, such as with a finger versus a pick or in the middle versus near the bridge. The children learned about the different ways sound can be produced thanks to Jacob's short visit at the end of our day. Thank you for sharing your talent with us Jacob!"

Mr. Grant - 5 & 6:

Fifth grade has been working on several different skills in reading class this past week. These include working on identifying and understanding themes in fictional texts. The class read a story that had themes of putting others above yourself and the dangers of trying too hard to impress someone. The class also has been working on identifying and correctly using action verbs and linking verbs. The students completed SMART board activities where they were to match the right verb in a given sentence.

Mrs. Gerardot - 2, 4, & 6 Reading:

6th grade has been working on making a game that can be played to practice our grammar skills. They have been learning about many different types of verbs. The students have been really enjoying the time they get to create these games. Look in next weeks newsletter for the picture of the finished project.

FINANCIAL REPORT

- PTA Balance as of today \$19,161.42 there are upcoming and anticipated costs that we'll
 incur
- Holiday Shop sales \$548.25
- Cookie Walk Sales \$575
- Target Grant \$700
- Risers we have paid for one set, still will owe for second set and stage, total of \$5,796 the amount we have to pay yet on the additional risers and new stage is \$2,864
- Our Balance will approximately be \$9,145.35 once we pay for known upcoming expenses for the rest of the year
- Anticipated expenses dance, teacher appreciation gifts, Catholic Schools Week, entry fees for field trips, AR & end of year awards, 4 basketball marathon teams
- Geranium Flowers sales yet, made \$2,412.75 last year
- New chest freezer for Hall? (Approximately \$428) Can be used for Apple Pie Fundraiser -Mr. Linder checking to see if the Payne Knights of Columbus would split this cost with us
- Does 1st/2nd grade classroom need white boards? the approximate cost to replace 4 chalkboards in the 1st/2nd grade room, and 2 chalkboards in the kindergarten room is \$2,628. We agreed that if the flower sales do well we would go ahead with this purchase.
- Playground border update things are getting expensive for this project. We have a quote for \$4,100 for the border materials (labor not included), and the also quoted us \$2,750 for engineered wood fiber mulch (installation not included). Most people agreed that if we can avoid the mulch cost the stones will be fine as is. Mr. Linder explained that the company will be doing a site visit very soon to determine if the swings will need to be moved in order to create enough safe space away from the border.
- Need to confirm that we are doing fall catalog sales again next year (made \$4,346.40 this year)
