
GATHOLIG SCHOOLS WEEKI

Classroom Curriculum News

Miss Kaufman - Kindergarten

In math class this past week, students have been working hard to figure out the difference between even and odd numbers. Students have realized that if you have an even number of something that means two people can have equal amounts. Whereas if its odd someone will have more while the other has less. To help remember even and odd numbers a little better, we have learned a little tune to help us remember how to count by 2's-which Simon concluded are the even numbers. Our song is..."2, 4, 6, 8, who do we appreciate? Our teacher, our teacher, our teacher, teacher, teacher!" We've also filled in saying "Our parents" sometimes as well! :) Ask a kindergartner to count by even numbers or by 2's sometime and see how far they will count!

Miss Shuster - Grades 1 & 2

This Friday, Grades 1 and 2 wrapped up their study of maps by having another "Learning Show and Tell." This time, each student shared a map that they drew of a place that was familiar to them - their bedroom, the school, the house of a relative, and even McDonald's! They included their own map key, as well as a compass with the cardinal directions. It was a great chance to apply what we learned, and also to get to know each other a little better. Miss Schuster was impressed by the careful work and creativity of the students!

Mrs. Gideon - Grades 3 & 4

This week in math the 4th graders (and 3rd graders who wished to participate) used paper patterns called 'nets' to construct geometric solids, which we learned are shapes that take up space. It was lots of fun while we learned the characteristics of of the various geometric solid shapes such as triangular prisms, rectangular prisms, cubes and more. (top picture)

This past week in reading, the fifth graders completed their final writing prompt for the year. The prompt was to select a potential future career and pick at three reasons as to why they selected that career. The exercise was intended to help students think logically and rationally as they write by selecting reasons for a given decision they come with details to support their reasoning.
