The pre-school had a very busy week practicing and putting the final touches on our performance for the Spring program. They also learned how to fold tissue paper that became a beautiful flower (top picture). On Tuesday, the class participated in a whole school fire drill. Miss Kaufman - Kindergarten

This past week in Kindergarten students began to learn about the sneaky e in phonics class. We began with words such as "cape" "take" and "late." Students learned that every time there was a word that had "a-e" the sneaky "e" at the end would make the letter "a" the long sound. Students realized that when there is a sneaky e in a word you will not sound the "e" out. The kindergartners have caught on really quick and are beginning to read other sneaky e words that use other vowel sounds!! Fantastic job super readers!!

Miss Shuster - Grades 1 & 2

Last week and this week, Grade 1 continued to celebrate the Season of Easter by making Resurrection Eggs during religion class. Each plastic egg contains a different object to remind us of the story of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. For example, the first egg holds a cracker in remembrance of the bread at the Last Supper on Holy Thursday that became the great gift of Christ's Body and Blood in the Eucharist. The last egg is kept intentionally empty - can you guess why? Ask one of the first-graders to tell you! (top picture)

Mr. Grant - Grades 5 & 6

In reading, the fifth graders have been learning about cause and effect in literature. They have been examining cause and effect in two different stories. They also worked in small groups reading about the Gold Rush out west and the causes that led to population growth of different western states. Students have also been learning about comparative adjectives and prefixes and suffixes in language arts.

During Second Grade reading the students have started writing a book. They are working in groups of 3 to do this. It is a very exciting time watching and listening to them use their imaginations to write this book. We started by writing a rough draft and then they transfer over to a different type of paper to rewrite it and draw pictures for the story.
