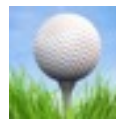

The following may never be worn: tank tops, short-shorts, torn pants, and clothing bearing alcoholic beverage advertisements or objectionable words/symbols. Divine Mercy Catholic School is an elementary school and the need for make-up is not necessary. Tank tops and spaghetti strap dresses may not be worn unless they have a sweater or jacket to wear over them. Parents are requested to cooperate in enforcing the dress code. Fall weather provides us with a variety of temperatures and conditions, so check the weather before choosing the clothes for the day. As you know, weather forecasts are not always accurate, so a sweatshirt or sweater packed in the book bag may come in handy if the temperature would drop during a school day.

Introductions of 2016-2017 Officers and Parents (15 parents, Mr. Grant, Mrs. Gideon, Mr. Linder, and Father Poggemeyer present. Everyone went around the room and introduced themselves, and told the name and grade of their child at the school)

- PTA President - Kimra Williamson
- Treasurer - Julie Stuart
- Co-Secretaries - Melanie Forrer/Michelle Davis

Financial Report (Mrs. Stuart - flower fundraiser from last spring raised about \$2,400. In the checking/savings account is now \$12,168.29 and this is not counting the \$5,000 Mr. Franklin donation that is set aside to be used on students)

- Approval to increase teachers school supply allotment (approved - teachers were getting \$100 per year to spend on supplies and classroom materials - now raised to \$250 per year/per teacher)
- Approval to pay for the new bathroom risers that the Lopshire's made for the boys bathroom by the urinals and the girl's bathroom under the sink (approved and very much appreciated - thank you Ernie and Donita)
- Bob Franklin's donation to the PTA (Under Armour Jacket's from Northwest Ohio Welch Trophy will be purchased - size samples are in the process of being ordered. An order sheet will be sent home to every family with an option to have student name embroidered on the jacket that the family would pay for out of their own pocket)
- additional points (Father brought up the idea of using some of the monies to purchase a border for the playground area to keep loose stones contained - ideas and estimates are being gathered on this to see how much it would cost)

Mr. Linder

- New volunteer website and other forms (Anyone who will be working with the students at events throughout the year needs to register with VIRTUS; which is an online program that the Diocese of Toledo uses. Mr. Linder is putting instructions in tomorrow's newsletter. Mr. Linder brought up the idea of using an online sign up for fundraisers: signup.com. This would help organize events by the number of people needed and specifically what each person would be doing. The group seemed to like the idea for larger projects like the apple pie fundraiser. More discussion to come on this.)
- AscendSMS online grade book update (Free online grade book system that we're working on implementing very soon. Teachers have just started to put grades into the grade book, but are still some bugs to be worked out. A parent letter will be sent home soon to let parents know how to get registered.)

Fundraisers

- Golf outing Saturday, September 10th - 17 teams (everything is set for this - pray for no rain!)
- All American Fundraiser ends September 9th with delivery October 10th
- Apple Pie sale dates October 5th-19th, we will be making the pies Saturday, November 12th. We will need volunteers 2-3 evenings the week of to do dry ingredients in the hall (Patty Lee volunteered to head up this years apple pie fundraiser. We spoke on how the hall will need to be prepared for event... putting plastic sheets down...people prepping the dry goods...Kimra's parents can pick up the apples.)

- Tuesday, October 4th, 2pm - Animal/pet blessing with Father Poggemeyer (like last years - out back of school in the grass. Can take your students home after it's over.)
- Pumpkin Patch - Lincoln Ridge or Kurtz Pumpkin Patch (Kimra is going to contact Lincoln Ridge. Mr. Linder is going to send dates to her to get something scheduled.)
- November 11th Mass at 9am or 11am with Father Stites; then lunch in the Hall and Veterans Program. Meal from Payne Elementary (chicken and noodles) - volunteers needed to set up and decorate tables (Mass will be at 11am with Father Stites with a short program and lunch to follow in the hall. Lunch will be coordinated through the Payne Elementary cafeteria.)
- Thanksgiving meal - Thursday, November 17th (will need a handful of volunteers for this meal for staff and students that will be in the Hall like normal.)
